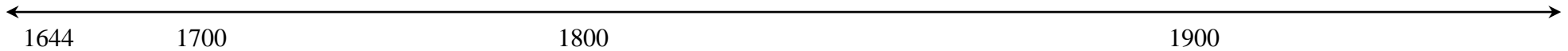

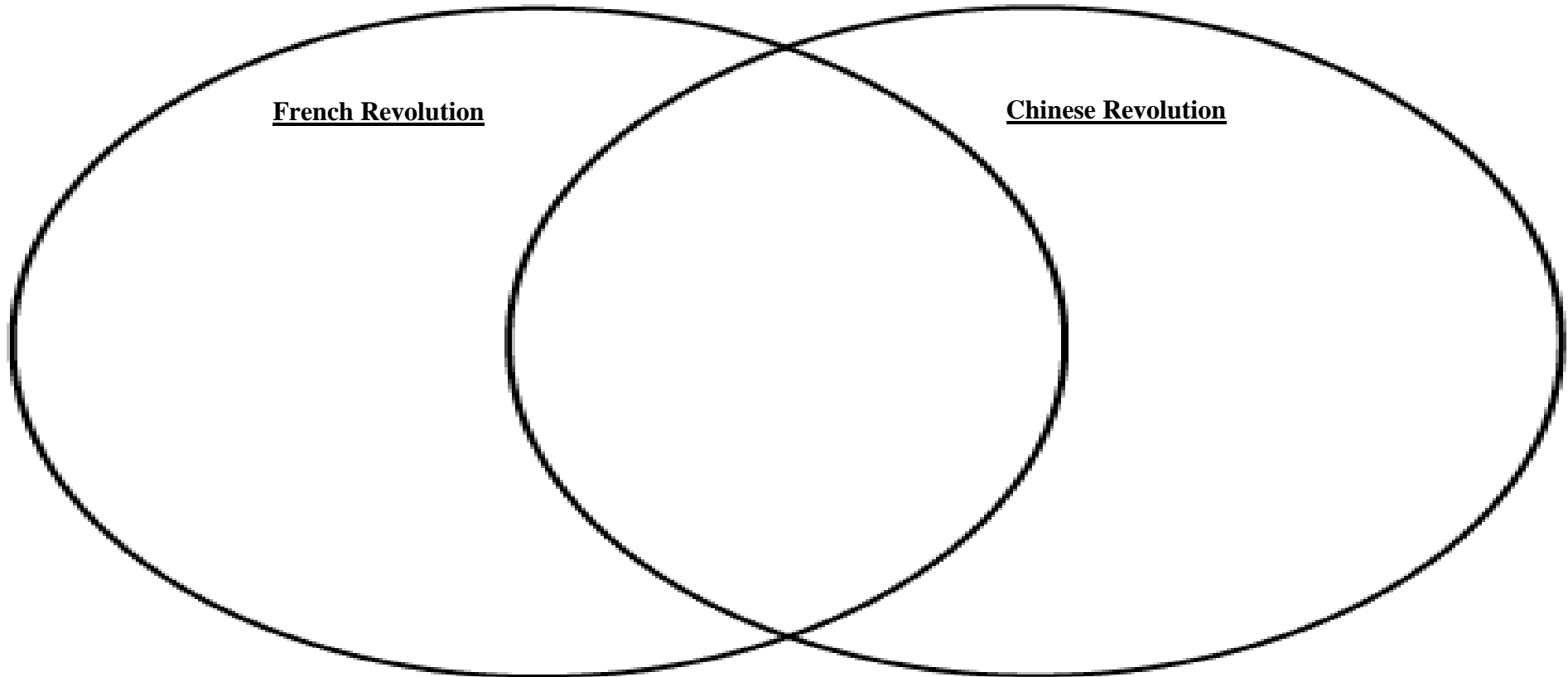
III. Individual work Answer the following questions using your textbook.
