Early Japan



Intro: Japan was once centralized under Shotoku Taishi, a prince. Eventually, however, Japan's central government could not overcome the power of rich land-owners. The emperor (representing a strong unified state) continued to exist, but held no REAL political power. Instead, this power transferred back to rich land owners (daimyo).
