- *Local elites were removed from power and replaced with a new set of officials brought from the mother country.*



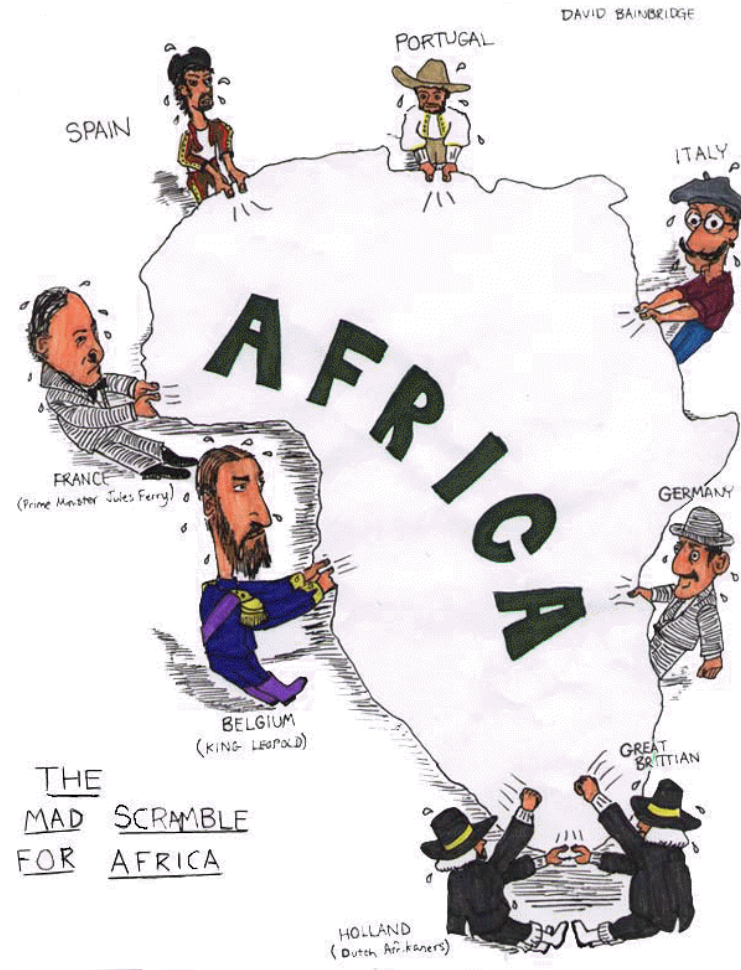
Indirect Rule

- *Local elites were kept in power to add legitimacy to the imperial rulers*

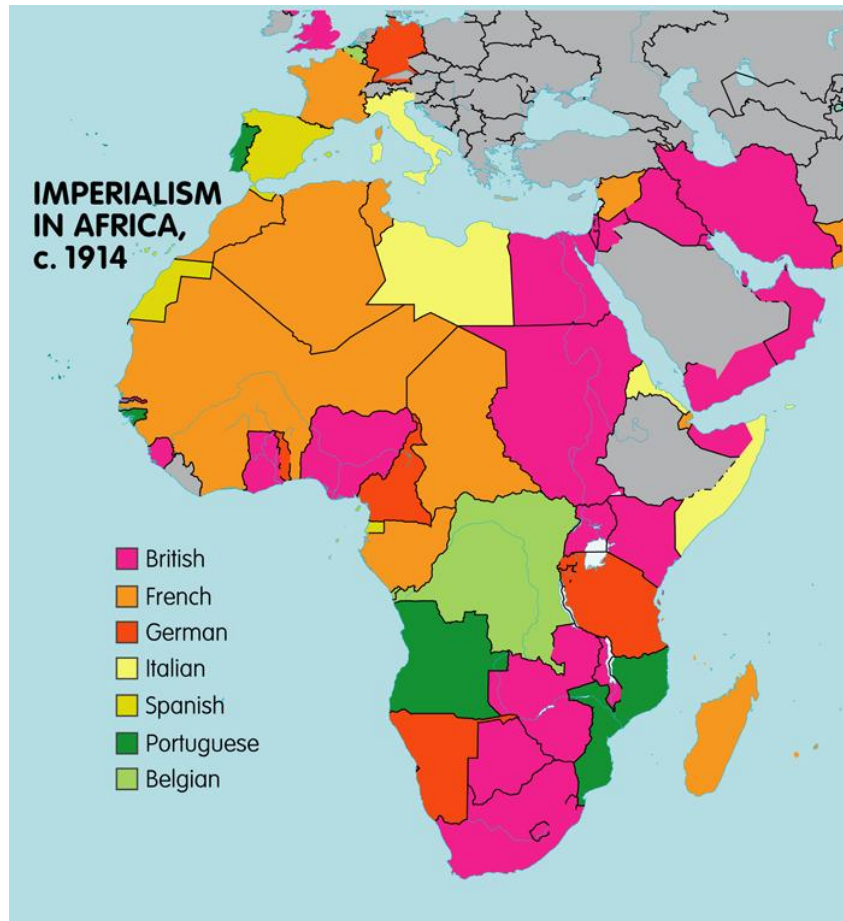


Imperialism

- *Policy of extending one country's rule over another with the purpose of economic exploitation of that country's natural resources.*



In what ways did African colonization change after 1880?



- *Increased competition among Western powers to colonize the continent.*
- *The Western powers that attended the Berlin Conference agreed to observe certain basic rules.*

And mark them with your dead.

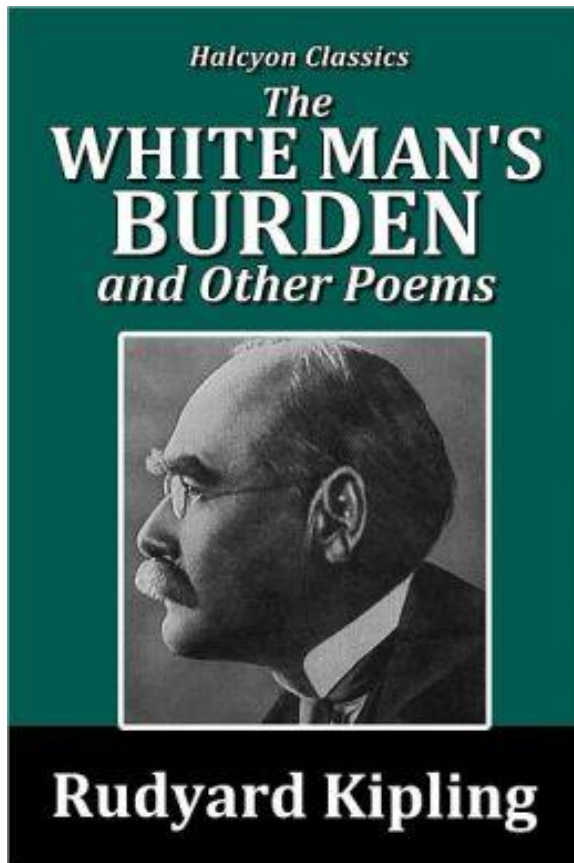
Take up the White Man's burden--

How did the Europeans (or Western) perceive Rudyard Kipling's "White Man's Burden"?



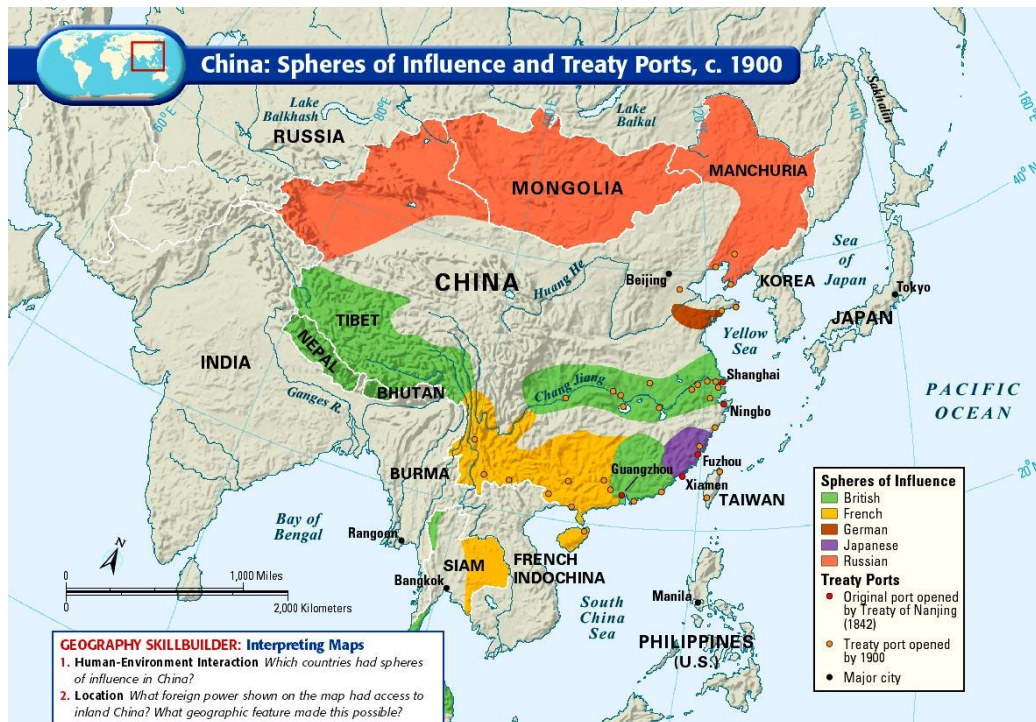
- *Europeans had a duty to introduce the benefits of their civilization to non-European peoples.*

Why did European traders deal directly with Chinese warlords for exclusive trading rights?



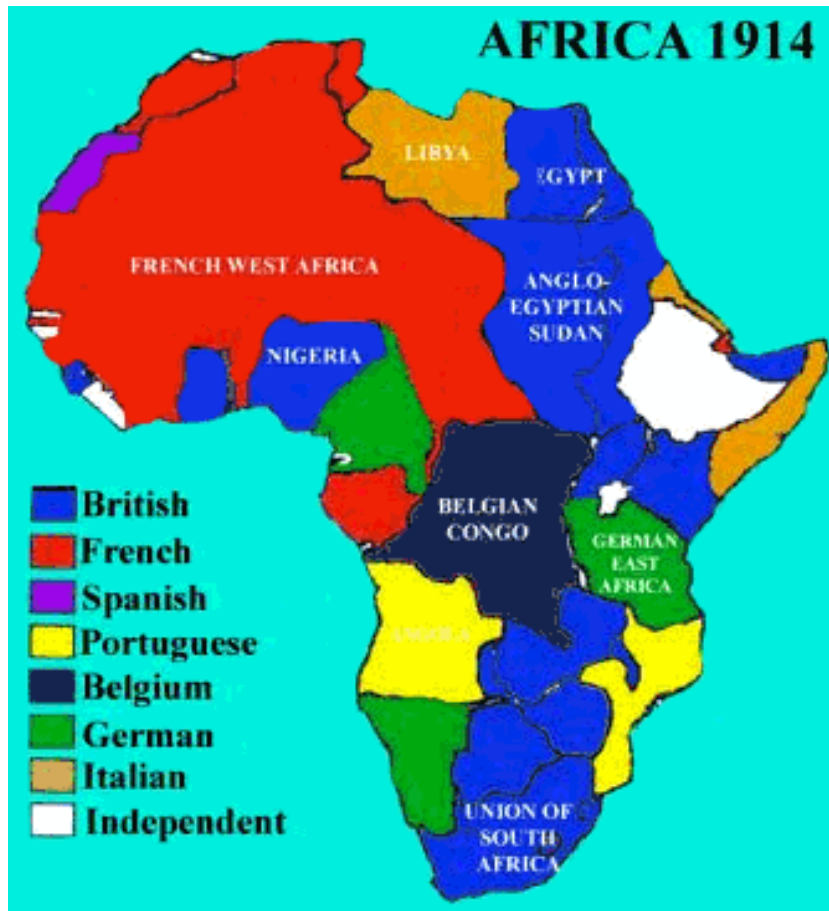
- *Established spheres of influence that barred others from trading within a specific region*

Why would some countries drastically increase their defense spending and improve their war technology?



Because of imperialism – you either wanted to be the country to expand or be a country that could defend yourself from others trying to expand.

What was the most important motive behind Europe's "Scramble For Africa"?



- *The need for raw materials*

Why did the British feel imperialism was important?



- *The British ended cultural practices in Africa they thought were “uncivilized”*
- *British imperialism benefitted the industries of Britain and their working class*
- *The British taught the African natives “justice”.*

What were the benefits of British rule in India?



- *There was an educated native elite*
- *The abolition of sati/suttee*
- *The construction of telegraphs and railroads*
