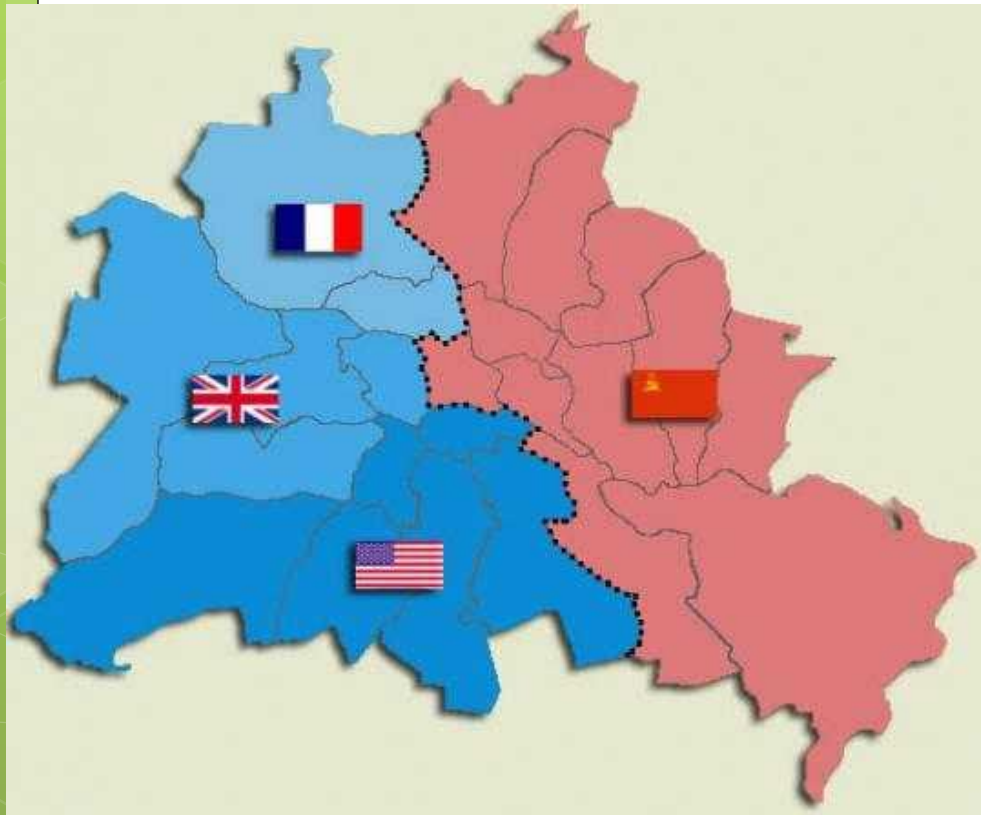

The United Nations was created primarily to do what?



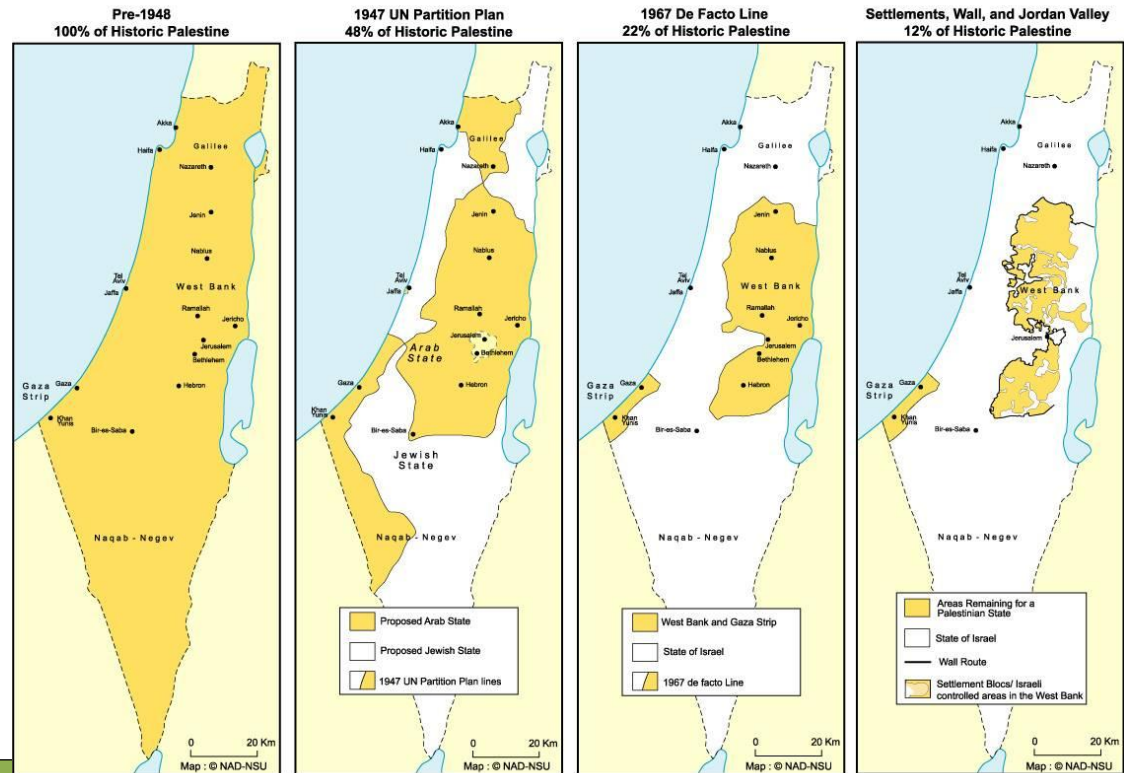
- To aid in solving international problems

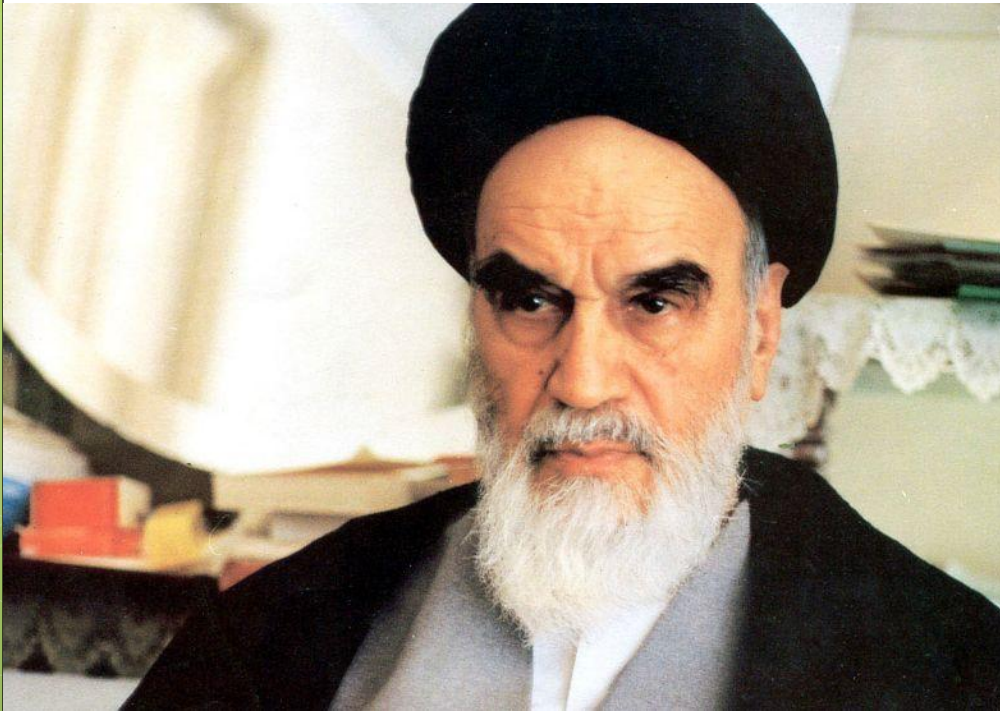

- Vital natural resources in a strategic location

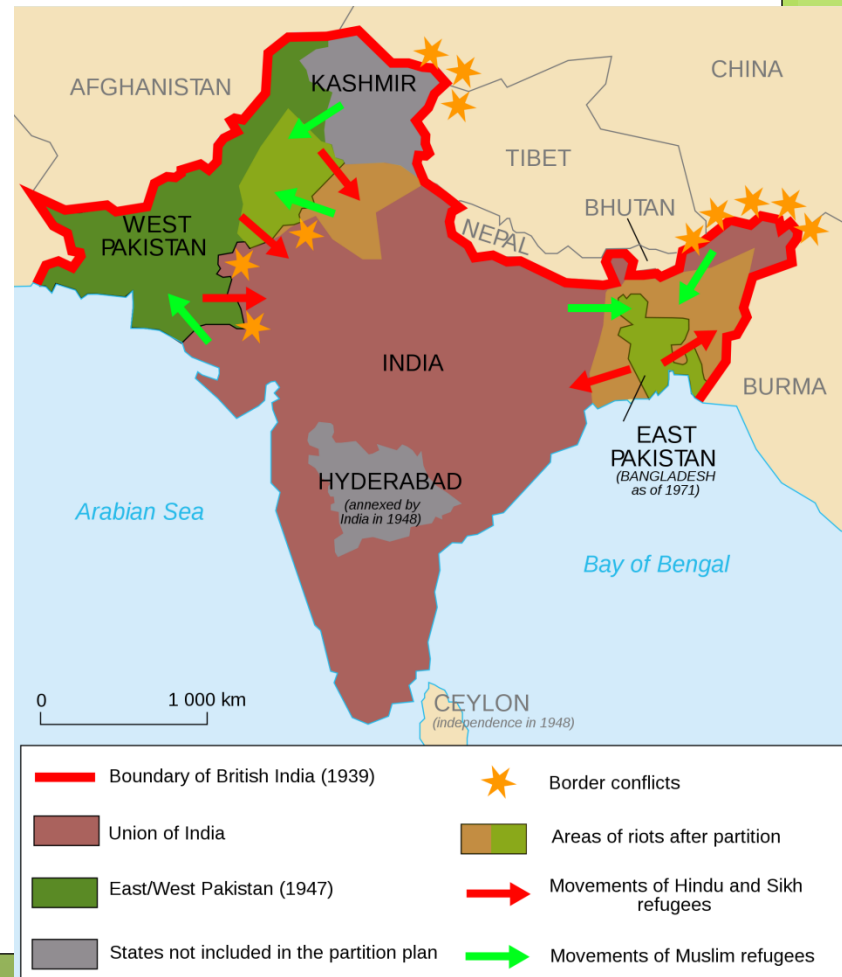
What is one way in which Iran's Ayatollah Khomeini and Afghanistan's Taliban were similar

Who was Yassir Arafat?



- While his supporters viewed him as a heroic freedom fighter who symbolized the national aspirations of the Palestinian people, his opponents described him as an unrepentant terrorist.
- Leader of the PLO

Who was Fidel Castro?



- He led the revolution overthrowing Fulgencio Batista in 1959 and shortly after was sworn in as the Prime Minister of Cuba
- He ruled for over 30 years

Who was Mao Zedong?

- Leader of the Chinese Communists
- Died in 1976
- Responsible for “Great Leap Forward”



Who was Gandhi?

- Indian leader that advocated non-violent protest against British imperialism in India
- Influenced civil rights and independence movements everywhere



Who was Ronald Reagan?

- He rejected détente and confronted Communism
- Famously portrayed the USSR as an “Evil Empire”

Who was Ayatollah Khomeini?

- Iranian leader that led the Iranian revolution in 1979, which turned Iran into an anti-Western theocracy.



Who was Nelson Mandela?

- South African leader imprisoned for 27 years for his anti-apartheid stance. Finally became president years later.



Who was Nikita Khrushchev?

- Soviet Union leader involved in the Cuban Missile Crisis
