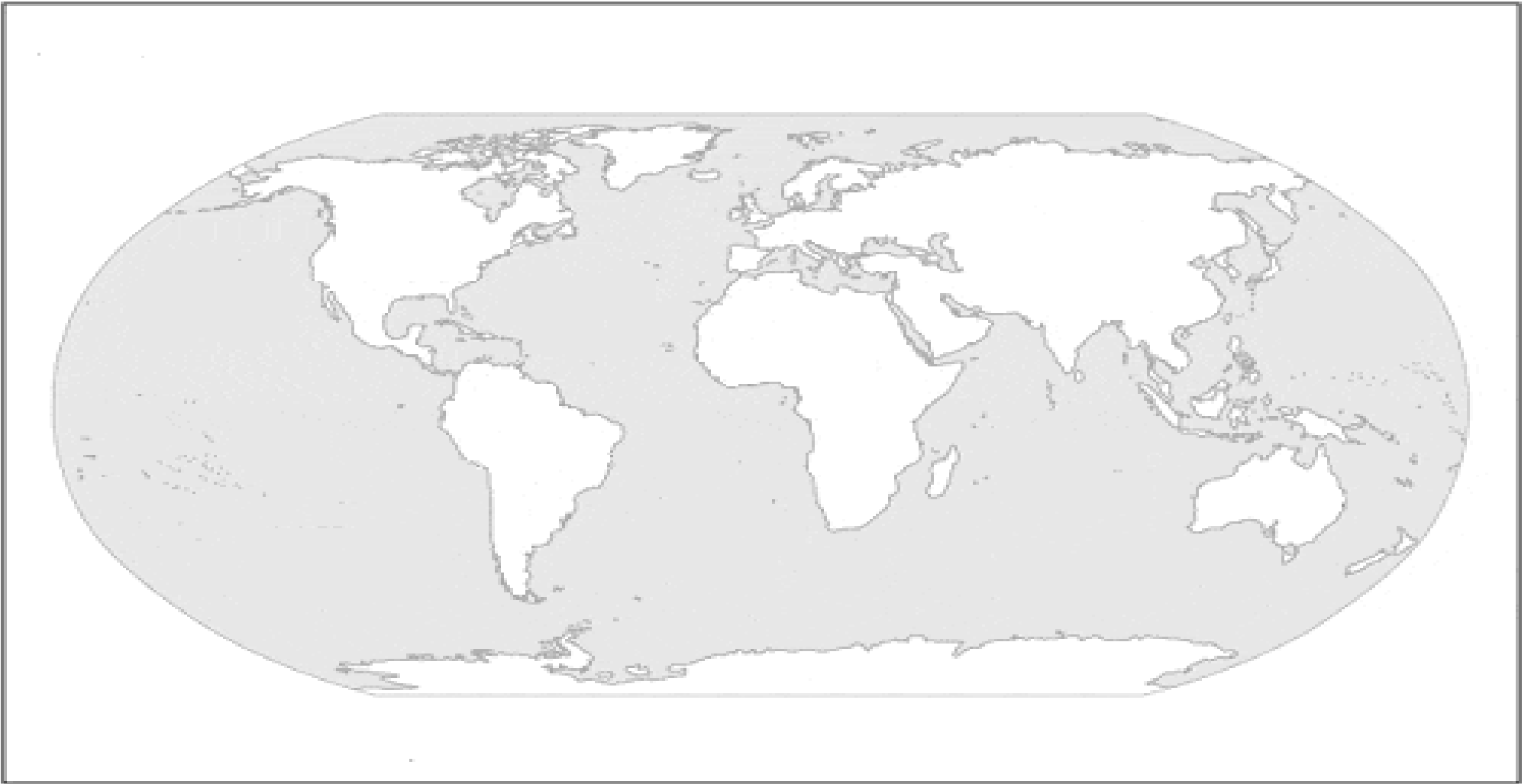

- Label the Schlieffen Plan

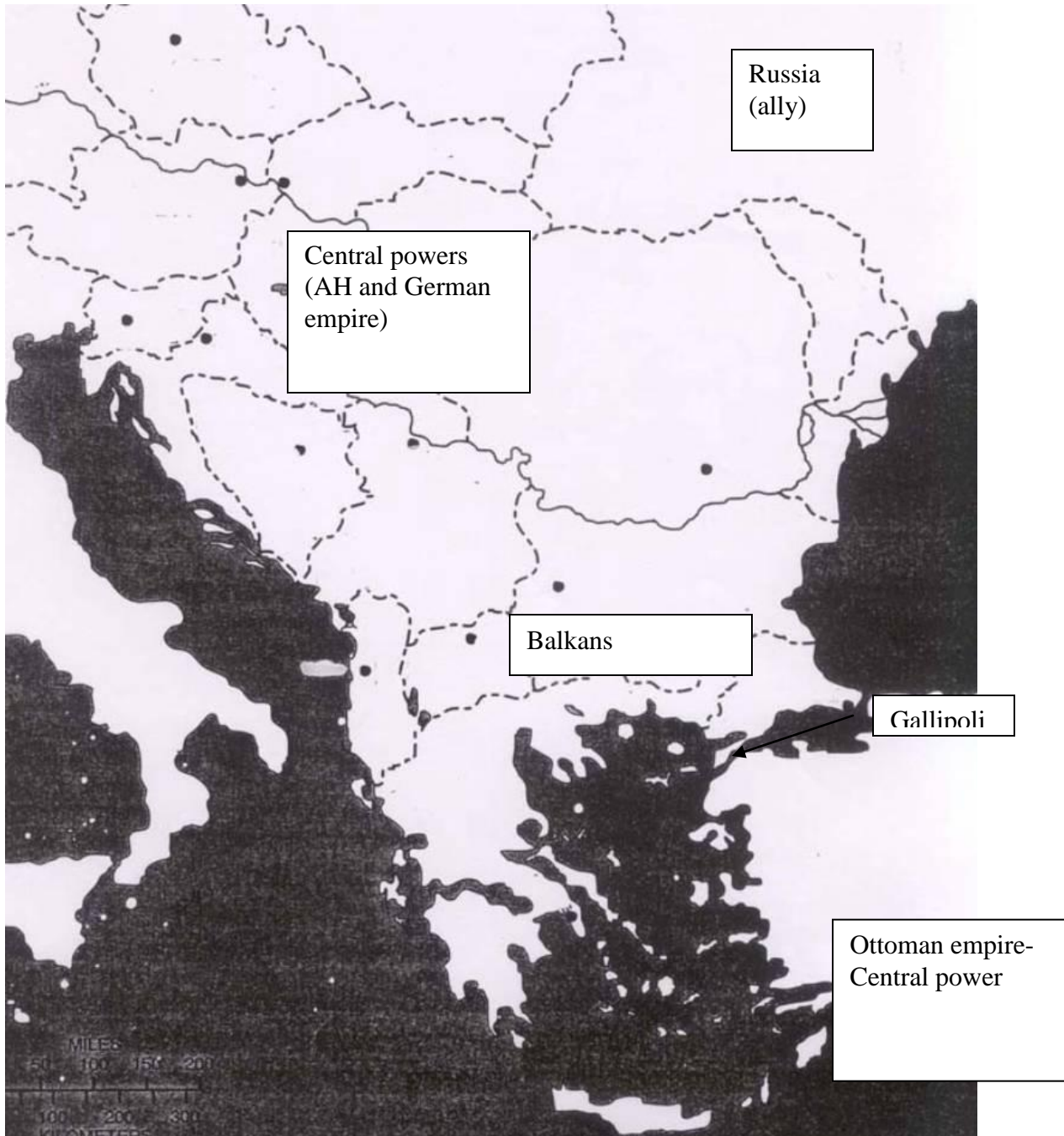


1. What is a “front”?
